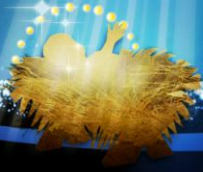


## “Full of Grace, Full of Truth”

John 1:14-18



- “Incarnation” – means “taking on flesh”. Used as a word to describe Jesus coming to earth in the form of a baby.
- John 1 shares the coming of Christ from a heavenly perspective.

### I. The Significance of Jesus

- We do not deserve Jesus coming to us, and yet God saw no other way for us to be set free from sin than to send His Son Jesus.

### I. The Significance of Jesus

- The disciples saw in Jesus: wisdom, love, grace, knowledge, peace, joy, faith, patience, kindness, temperance and above all holiness.
- The world has never, or will ever, see a man like Jesus again!

### I. The Significance of Jesus

- Without the “truth” of the Gospel message, no one would see their need of Christ.
- Without “grace,” God would not offer such salvation to sinners.

### II. The Testimony About Jesus


- “Grace upon grace” comes to Christians as waves continue to come to the shore. The Christian life is the constant reception of one evidence of God’s grace replacing another.

### III. The Strength of Jesus

### III. The Strength of Jesus

- In Jesus, God was made visible when the light of Christ was given.
- Only Jesus is uniquely qualified to interpret God to man, since Jesus is God.
