

The Judgment of the Gentiles

- ☞ Joel 3:1-2; Matthew 25:31-46 speaks of this judgment taking place near Jerusalem (Valley of Jehoshaphat).
- ☞ Those who are welcomed into Messiah's Kingdom are the "sheep" of Matthew 25.
- ☞ The unsaved are the "goats".

The Judgment of the Gentiles

- ☞ Gentiles are judged by the way in which they treated Israel during the Great Tribulation.
- ☞ Saved Gentiles will enter the Millennium in their early bodies and will be a part of the repopulating of the earth.

The Judgment of the Jews

- ☞ This judgment focuses on Jews who are living at the end of the tribulation period.
- ☞ The Lord will determine which are saved and which are not.
- ☞ The "rebels" will be cut off (Ezekiel 20:34-38, Matthew 25:1-30).

The Judgment of the Jews


- ☞ Jewish believers who have made it through the tribulation will not receive immortal bodies and will be part of the repopulation of the earth.

The Judgment of OT and Tribulation Saints

- ☞ This judgment focuses on those who died either in the Tribulation or millenniums earlier in OT times.
- ☞ Daniel 12:2-3, Matthew 16:27, Revelation 20:4-6 speak of this event.

The Judgment of OT and Tribulation Saints

- ☞ Daniel 12:13 shows that Daniel (OT Saint) will be raised and rewarded during this time.
- ☞ When combined with Rev. 20:4-6, the righteous are raised and rewarded before the Millennial Kingdom.



The Marriage Supper of the Lamb

- ☞ Revelation 19:9 speaks of the those who are invited to the marriage supper of the Lamb.
- ☞ The church has already been married to Christ, after the Rapture and before the Second Coming of Christ.

The Marriage Supper of the Lamb

- ☞ The Marriage supper takes place on earth in which believing Jews and Gentiles that have made it through the tribulation will be invited.

The Future Kingdom

- ☞ There are two phases to God's future Kingdom:
 - ☞ The millennial kingdom (Messianic)
 - ☞ God's eternal Kingdom

The Purpose of God's Kingdom

- ☞ To reestablish His rulership over the earth through Jesus.
 - ☞ Psalm 2:7-9; Isaiah 11:1-5
- ☞ To fulfill the promise of the Covenants God made w/ Israel.

Characteristics of the Millennial Kingdom

- ☞ Government – Jesus will reign as the King (Psalm 2:1-9; Isaiah 9:6-7; Ezekiel 34:23-25).
- ☞ Jesus will be the benevolent dictator of the entire earth.

Characteristics of the Millennial Kingdom: Government

- ☞ The subjects of Messiah's rulership are those who enter into the Kingdom.
- ☞ Jesus promised that the Twelve will sit on 12 thrones ruling over the 12 tribes of Israel (Matt. 19:28).
- ☞ King David will be a prince under the rulership of Jesus (Ezekiel 34:24)

Characteristics of the Millennial Kingdom: Government

- ☞ Faithful Christians will rule over the scattered Gentile nations during the Millennial Kingdom (Luke 19:12-27; 2 Timothy 2:12; Revelation 5:10; 20:4).
- ☞ Regardless of the setup, Jesus is the unquestioned King of all kings!
