

- Jesus likely goes to Gentile territory for a break from the increasing pressure that He was facing in His earthly ministry.
- Vs. 24 seems to set the scene in such a way that Mark justifies the apparent harshness of Jesus' response to the woman.

I. A Desperate Need

- It is clear that she is in the middle of a major crisis – her daughter is demon possessed.
- As soon as she knows Jesus is in the area she immediately goes to Him.

I. A Desperate Need

• Here is a Gentile woman humbling herself at the feet of Jesus ... placing herself at His mercy.

II. A Curious Response

- Jesus seems to push her aside giving the impression that He wants nothing to do with her.
- Jesus' response is consistent with who He is and what He came to do.

II. A Curious Response

Time and again Jesus makes it clear that
His ministry, and the ministry of the
disciples, is to be directed to the house of
Israel.

III. Unshakeable Faith

- Jesus has left the door slightly open. Jesus says "Let the children be satisfied first".
- Jesus calls the woman a dog it is not as degrading as it first seems for it is used to describe a lap or house dog. This dog sits under the table licking the crumbs that fall.

III. Unshakeable Faith

• If Jesus were to fulfill her request the blessing would not even be missed by those who were eating the bread at the table of the Lord.

III. Unshakeable Faith

• This Gentile woman really understands who Jesus is and how He works. He is a compassionate Messiah who will respond to those who come to Him in faith no matter what background they have.

III. Unshakeable Faith

- Like this woman, we also must act in faith. Faith which fully expects to see the compassion of Jesus poured out on us.
- Faith, which comes before the Lord in prayer fully anticipating a response from Him.

Jesus wants everyone to know; the disciples, the crowds, the readers of the Gospel who He is. He is the Lord who will show great compassion to all who come to Him in faith
