The Text...

- Since the disciples were unable to heal him, the scribes were challenging the validity of their ministry.
- Jesus rebuked all the people for their lack of faith, calling them a "faithless generation".

The Text...

- At the heart of this exorcism is the struggle for faith, not the struggle with a demon.
- This truth does not mean that faith can accomplish anything but that those who have faith "will set no limits to the power of God.

The Text...

 A life governed by faith and prayer can repel the threat from the evil spirits.

I. A Statement of Sheer Honesty

- This man was being as honest with the Lord as he possibly could.
- Which is the greater sin?
 Faltering in our faith, or faking our faith?

II. A Statement of Sincere Desire

- The boys father knew he had a measure of trust for Christ, but that it could be stronger!
- Perhaps Jesus is saying to us this morning, "Why isn't your faith where it needs to be?"

II. A Statement of Sincere Desire

 A major contribution to growing faith comes from trials and suffering.

III. A Statement of Serious Concern

- · The father "cried out".
- There is probably no feeling of desperation so intense, as a parent who cannot help his child!

III. A Statement of Serious Concern

 When we face up to our faltering faith, we give God room to do what ONLY HE CAN DO!!
