- The bottom line is the Gospel and how many are coming to know Christ personally and are following Him as a disciple.

I. Fighting the Wrong Battle

 Jesus logically stated, "You can't perform ministry in My name and be against Me at the same time."

II. Destroying the Weak

- The Greek word for stumbling is skandalizo which is where we get our English word scandal from.
- "These little ones" includes those who are new believers, people whose faith is fragile and tender.

II. Destroying the Weak

 Tolerating sin in our lives, pursuing factious behavior in our relationships, and diminishing the calling to follow Christ causes us to stunt a young believer's growth.

III. Missing Our Sin

- "It says something about our times that we rarely use the word sinful except to describe a really good dessert." (Willard Ferrell)
- Nothing is so important as your relationship with God.

III. Missing Our Sin

- In a series of strong statements, Jesus emphasized how terrible sin is.
- Jesus instead emphasizes the necessity of a decisive rejection of sin.

IV. Our Saltiness Is At Stake

- "Everyone" is a reference to every person in general.
- For nonbelievers, the preserving fire of final judgment; for disciples, the refining fire of present trials and suffering.

IV. Our Saltiness Is At Stake

 "Salt" depicts what distinguishes a disciple from a person who only claims to know Jesus. A disciple is to maintain his allegiance to Jesus at all costs and to purge out destructive influences.
