



- The Sadducees poor handling of Scripture has caused them to miss out on one of the core truths of the Bible.

- Eisegesis is the process of interpreting a text or portion of text in such a way that the process introduces one's own presuppositions, agendas, or biases into and onto the text.
- "What does it mean...to me?"

- "What did the original author intend when he wrote this?"
- What do I see? (Observation)
- What does it mean? (Interpretation)
- How does it work? (Application)

Matthew 18:20

- "For where two or three have gathered together in My name, I am there in their midst."

Revelation 3:20

- "Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and will dine with him, and he with Me."

Philippians 4:13

- "I can do all things through Him who strengthens me."

I. Who Are They?

- The Sadducees were a religious sect in Israel that were considered the ultra-conservative fundamentalists.

I. Who Are They?

- They did not believe in the resurrection or angels, and only believed the Pentateuch was authoritative to the Jewish people.

II. An Ignorant Question

- The question of the Sadducees is based on Deut. 25:5-10.
- If the lines went extinct then the inheritance promised by God to the tribes of Israel could not be fulfilled.

II. An Ignorant Question

- The Sadducees did not respect Jesus.
- "In the resurrection, when they rise again, which one's wife will she be? For all seven had married her?"

III. Problem Solved

- The Sadducees were wrong for two reasons:
 - They misunderstood the Scriptures
 - They denied God's power

III. Problem Solved

- When you are tempted to deny that God is able to work in your life, remember that He has raised His Son from the dead. As a result, you have life!

So What?

- Every person, in all time, will be resurrected.



The Good News of the Gospel is that God has rescued us through the gift of His Son Jesus Christ from the finality of the resurrection of the unsaved.
