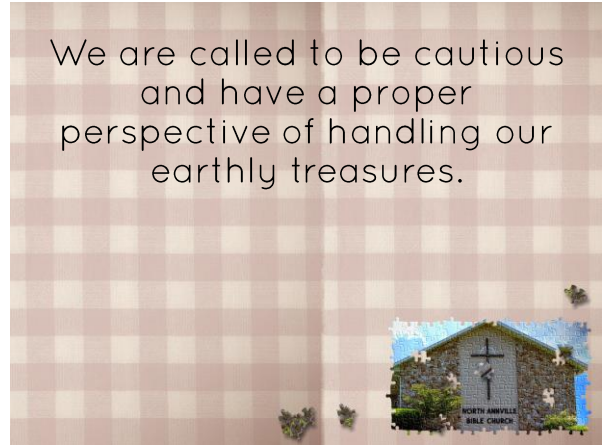


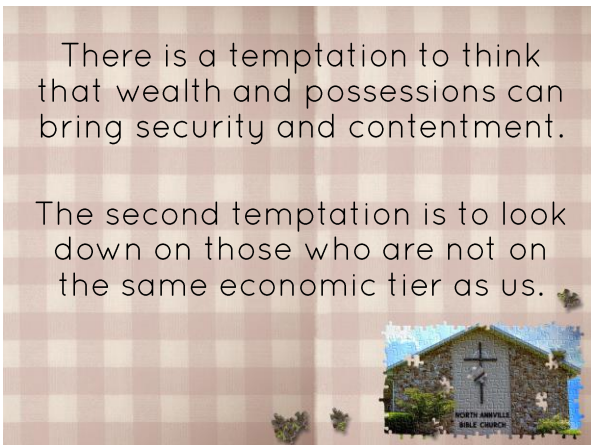

earthly treasures.

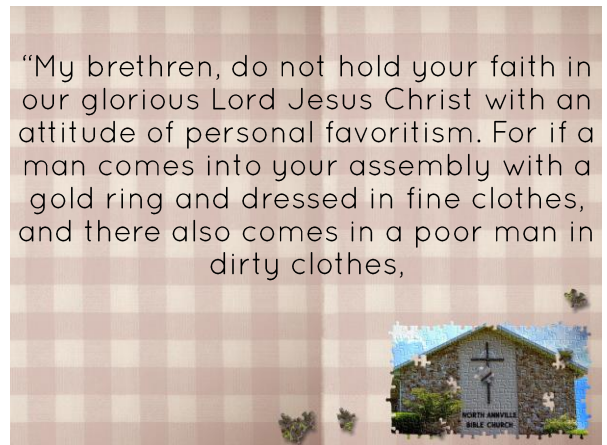


There is a temptation to think
