




God's Purpose for

I. The Power to Commission

 - Discipleship takes time; this is probably our biggest hang up.

III. The Promise of His Commission

- If there would be any fear for us to take on the task of discipleship, then we should pause, pray, and consider the promise that Jesus is always present.

- If we are spiritually lazy and careless in ministry then we will struggle to make disciples.

Consider this . . .

- You need to either be discipled, or you should be disciplining someone.
- Discipleship is best accomplished outside the classroom.
- Discipleship takes time, but it is worth it.
- In your discipleship journey remember to follow Jesus.
